Our Doctor of Ministry program allows you to remain in the location where you are ministering. One-week intensive courses form the core of the course curriculum, making travel requirements minimal. Through a cooperative arrangement with Western Seminary (Portland, OR), you will be able to take classes toward your DMin from Phoenix Seminary or from Western Seminary
